#### Auction Report:

Our Auction was held on Saturday, November 16 at Corpus Christie Parish Hall. Thanks to everyone who helped to make this auction a success.

Thank you to everyone who donated items to be auctioned. Thirty-six Guild members and four former members donated almost 300 hand-stitched items, ranging in size from small scissor fobs to large framed pictures. Of these, 47 items were assigned to the 36 live auction lots; 108 were put into the silent auction in 90 lots; and the

remaining items were sold in Mystery Bags. In addition to the hand-made items, our silent auction also included a \$50 framing certificate, two \$25 Fabricville gift cards, an embroidery stand; a container of specialty threads donated by Guild members; and an 'Embroidery Bag for Beginners', complete with patterns, books, thread, fabrics, needles, scissors and so forth, also donated by Guild members. We also sold temari balls stitched by Sandy French and Iceberg canvas kits.

Thank you to everyone who donated door prizes. We had a nice selection of prizes – sealskin Christmas ornaments; two hand-made Christmas decorations; Christmas napkins, candle and coasters; wine and cheeses; a wallet and scarf set; an emergency car lantern; a decorative lantern with votive candles; and gift certificates for framing and for hairdressing.

Thank you to everyone who worked during the Auction on Saturday morning. Auctioneers, ticket sellers, recorders, spotters, sellers of the mystery bags, runners and packers – all were essential and all worked together to make the Auction run relatively smoothly. Thank you to the two Starfish Youth Stitchers who did an admirable job of displaying the items during the Live Auction and to our two novice auctioneers, Gillian Brown and Judith Peckham.

Attendance at the auction was less than in the two previous auctions. This year, we sold 134 tickets (as opposed to 172 in 2012 and 158 in 2015), nine of which were sold at the door. There were 113 registered bidders.

Our bottom line is that, after paying all our bills, we made a net profit of \$9372.33.
