

# Monthly Project

#### A note from Jewel:

In the next three months, our guild project is going to be a blackwork box of chocolates. Elizabeth Almond has many free designs on her website and you can download the instructions from there.



I used a 24 count aida but you could use aida or linen. I used 3371 as my colour to outline the individual motifs and for the border.

To start your work, decide on how many delights you are going to do and put in your first row. I did the outlines and borders with 2 strands of floss and the blackwork patterns with just 1 strand.

Count, count, and count again. I stitched the first row 3 times before I got it correct.

You can use the patterns that Elizabeth provides or haul out your blackwork books and try something new.
