This app just gives a red or green signal to show that two vaccinations have been recorded, or not. If the reading is green proceed to find your seat in the hall, if it is red, please, go home. We have consent forms prepared to state that we are allowed to keep a record that your vaccination record has been shown, and are asking people to sign the consent form, so that arriving at guild in the future will be much more straight forward. The QR reader app doesn't keep any info it just goes red or green. You can download the NLVaxPass to your phone or print it off your computer. We will do our best to move through this all as quickly and efficiently as possible, so we can get on to more interesting things.

Mary Pippy will still be receiving membership dues, so that we can have our list in to EAC/ACB for November 1st. If you have received an email reminder from Mary and haven't paid this is your golden opportunity to get that done!

Jewel and her program committee have been working really hard to bring us more great ideas. The canvas work notebook study will be continuing. Gillian Brown will be starting the surface work piece that she has planned for the year, suitable for beginners and onward. Jewel will have a poppy for Remembrance Day.
